

Community Update



Mountsorrel Quarry's new permanent screenhouse

Welcome to the latest update from Mountsorrel Quarry.
Our quarry, renowned for its distinctive pink rock, plays a vital role in supplying materials for construction and infrastructure projects across Leicestershire and beyond.

In this newsletter, you'll get an update on our replacement screenhouse, the community projects we have been supporting, and on our planning application for a northern and southeastern extension to the quarry.

Reducing our impacts with our new permanent screenhouse

In 2022, we experienced a serious fire at the quarry that resulted in severe damage to our screenhouse. This rendered the screenhouse inoperable. The building is essential to our operations as it is where we sort the crushed stone into different sizes.

To continue to meet local and national demand for our mineral, we had to use a temporary mobile screening plant throughout last year. We were granted planning approval for the replacement screenhouse in August 2023 and construction progressed immediately.

We're pleased to confirm that the new screenhouse is now complete. It will again completely enclose our mineral screening operations, reducing the potential for noise and dust. We have also invested in the latest technologies, including an internal dust suppression system. Additional cladding will more effectively seal the building compared to the previous screenhouse. We are also re-training our team on site as the equipment we are now using is more technologically advanced with more options and tighter controls than anything we've operated before.

The commissioning of the screenhouse took place during the first half of this year. We removed

the mobile processing plant earlier in the year. This will reduce dust and noise from the quarry processing operations. We recognise there has been a local impact following the fire due to the use of temporary operations and thank residents for their understanding during this challenging period.

Our dust monitoring data

Charnwood Borough Council publishes its own independent monitoring of the air quality around Mountsorrel Quarry. However, last year, following feedback from residents, we committed to publishing our own dust monitoring data on a quarterly basis. Supporting community projects

Since 2020, the Tarmac Landfill Communities Fund has provided over £125,000 to the communities around the quarry as well as ad hoc project support through donations and volunteering. In the last year we have supported several exciting community projects. This includes Barrow upon Soar's community managed library where we provided them with a donation to resurface their car park.

An operational update

We are currently extracting granite in the southern and eastern sections of the quarry, where the old primary crusher used to be located. To work on this particular area, we may need to use a breaker. This is a piece of machinery that prepares the quarry benches for extraction by breaking up the uneven top layer of the rock, creating a level platform for our subsequent blasting activities.

This machinery has been a part of our operations at Mountsorrel for years. However, we acknowledge that operating in this section has led to noise levels carrying more than usual.

We want to assure those of you who may have experienced higher than usual noise levels that these will decrease as we move into the next sections of the quarry. In the meantime, we have taken steps to mitigate the impact of noise:

Restricted hours: If necessary, we will only use the breaker between the hours of 9am and 5pm.

Advance notice: Those on our blasting mailing list will receive emails informing them of the scheduled use of the breaker.

Planning application

We submitted our planning application for a northern and southeastern extension to Mountsorrel Quarry in October. Our proposals seek to increase the working life of the quarry by 18 years to 2058.

We have recently received what is known as a Reg 25. This is where a planning authority, in this case LCC, requests applicants submit additional information required for a planning determination. We are currently preparing this additional information and once we have responded, the application will go out for further consultation, once again providing local residents with the opportunity to submit their views.
