They offer hands-on experience, real-world learning and the opportunity to build a long-term career. An apprenticeship at Tarmac equips people with the skills, knowledge and confidence to shape their future. Our theme this year is 'Skills for Life' – something we're passionate about cultivating.

#### A STATE OF THE ART START: THE NATIONAL SKILLS AND SAFETY PARK

A key part of an apprentice's journey at Tarmac is training at our National Skills and Safety Park in Nottinghamshire. Opened by HRH The Prince of Wales in 2020, this industry-leading facility provides hands-on training in a realistic environment, ensuring apprentices gain the practical skills and operational knowledge needed to thrive in the construction industry.

#### What to Expect from a Tarmac Apprenticeship

Our apprenticeships cater to different skills and interests:

- Indoors: often called 'corporate functions', these roles support the business behind the scenes such as finance, IT, marketing, HR and procurement.
- Outdoors: operational roles in engineering and quarry management

- to HGV drivers, and machine operators.
- Hybrid: a mix of both office and sitebased roles in areas like commercial, technical, and project management.

Born and raised in Leicestershire, he's been on our apprentice programme for the last two years. We sat down for a chat with him to hear more about his experience.

#### Q: What does a typical day look like for you?

A: My day usually starts with a team briefing to discuss priorities. I could then be involved in production planning, auditing stock levels, liaising with suppliers, or problem-solving operational challenges. I balance this hands-on learning with university coursework as part of my Degree apprenticeship.

#### Q: What's the most interesting thing you've learnt so far?

A: The complexities of operations management. So much goes on behind the scenes to keep operations running smoothly – from supply chain logistics to production planning. I have gained a real appreciation for how different departments have to work together to deliver quality materials efficiently whilst minimising the impact on the communities around the site.

# Q: What advice would you give to someone thinking about starting an apprenticeship?

A: Just go for it! Apprenticeships offer real-world experience while earning a degree or qualification. Be proactive, ask questions, and take every opportunity to learn. Although it's cliché, the more effort you put in, the more you will get out of it.
